Valley-Wide Transit Growth – 25 years

Population – Doubled
3.8 million in 2010
Miles of operation – Tripled



- 31 million annual revenue miles
- Transit boardings Quadrupled
 - 72 million annual passengers



Defining Success: LRT Ridership

- Exceeding all expectations:
 - Exceeded opening year forecast by 34%
 - Nearing 2020 ridership projection
 - Current 44,000/day
 - Super Bowl all-time high 126,000





Development Along Light Rail

- \$6.9 billion total investment
- 16,500+ residential units
- 13M sq. ft. commercial
- 3,500+ hotel rooms


Future Transit System




Route Options Under Consideration






Downtown Glendale Options





Key Survey Results

- Business and property owners in two focus areas in downtown and along Glendale Ave.
- Majority say promoting economic development/ improvement is a priority
- Majority prefer some type of improved transit and feel improved transit will benefit them





Why is consideration of improved transit important for Glendale?

- Improve mobility
- Connect to existing Valley Metro light rail
 - Downtown Glendale and West Phoenix
 - Major activity centers
- Funding potential to lose federal/regional dollars
- Support local planning priorities
 - Transportation
 - Economic development
 - Land use



Economic Development Impacts

- Regional Light Rail results:
 - 170 projects
 - \$6.9 billion capital investment
 - \$5.4 billion is private sector



- Projected positive economic impacts:
 - 32-39% increase in tax revenue
 - 27-30% increase in property values
 - 17-22% increase in employment
 - 9-14% increase in population
- National return on investment is 3.7 to 1 (370%)



Planning and Land Use Impacts

- Glendale Centerline Project
- Opportunity for Transit
 Oriented Development
- Minimum of 92 vacant land parcels (14%)
- Vacancy rates higher than city-wide average


