City Council Input on Expanding Locations Where Chickens May be Kept

February 7, 2017



Background on ZTA16-02

January 2016:

- City Council gave direction to initiate a Zoning Text Amendment to expand where a reasonable number of chickens may be kept in Glendale
 - Only allow hens (no roosters);
 - Require hens be contained on the property by either fences or cages;
 - Do not override existing HOA rules; and
 - Existing City Codes for noise and odor will apply



Background on ZTA 16-02 (Continued)

August 2016:

Citizen Participation Meeting

- Approximately 85 persons were in attendance
- Speaker Cards were collected

September 2016:

Planning Commission Workshop

- Commissioners were informed of City Council's direction on ZTA16-02
- ZTA16-02 was Initiated ZTA16-02 at a Workshop
- Commissioners asked questions of staff



Background on ZTA 16-02 (Continued)

December 2016:

- Planning Commission Workshop Feedback
 - Lot/Yard size
 - Distance from neighbors
 - Quantity of chickens
 - Chickens should not be classified as pets
 - Identify permitted location(s) for chickens on a property
 - Coops should follow building code guidelines
 - Do not permit chickens to be kept in apartments or townhomes
 - Consider including neighbors in the process
 - Allow chickens based upon residential use of a property

Based upon your input we will:


- Work with the City Attorney's Office to craft specific ZTA language

- Bring the ZTA to the Planning Commission for a hearing and recommendation
- Bring the ZTA to City Council for a hearing and vote




Where should the keeping of chickens be allowed within Glendale?

- Expand to include all single family zoning districts (R1-10, R1-8, R1-7, R1-6 and R1-4)
- Expand to include all occupied properties in multi-family zoning districts
- Expand based upon the size of a property (i.e. 4,000 sq. ft. and larger)
- Expand based upon the use of a property
- Do not expand
- Any other options identified by City Council





If the Expansion of Chickens Included R1-10, R1-8, R1-7, R1-6 and R1-4



Where should the keeping of chickens be allowed within Glendale?

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What is the maximum number of chickens that will be permitted on any one property where the keeping of chickens is expanded through ZTA?

- Establish a reasonable number based upon the size of a property
- Establish a uniform maximum number for all properties
- Establish a maximum based upon the occupancy of a property
- Do not establish a maximum number of chickens
- Any other options identified by City Council



Should the ZTA include a stipulation that clarifies how and where chickens can be kept on a property?

- Require chickens be contained by either fences, coops, cages or structures
- Prohibit keeping chickens in front yards
- Don't require limitations where chickens may be kept
- Restrict placement of a chicken fence, coop, cage or structure within 25' of a neighboring property
- Require obtaining permission from a neighboring property owner/occupant if chickens are to be kept within 25' of a structure on a neighboring property
- Do not establish a limitation of how and where chickens are kept
- Any other options identified by City Council



Additional Confirmations Needed

- ZTA applies only to chickens (no other animals)
- Chickens are not being considered as pets
- Only hens will be permitted (no roosters)
- ZTA language will not supersede existing HOA rules
- Current City Codes (Chapter 25, Article II, Section 25-24(f)(g)(h)) will apply for animal noise and waste removal





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
