Purpose

- Mayor Weiers requested at August 2, 2016 workshop
- Two Questions
 - Fare Structure for Dial-A-Ride Users
 - Higher rate for ADA service
- Staff met with the Mayor on October 12
- Staff is seeking guidance on possibility of fare adjustment



Dial-A-Ride





History of Dial-A-Ride (DAR)

- Started in 1975 as a 6 month demonstration project – first of its kind in Arizona
- Originally contracted with a vendor
- City took over operations in 1977
- Last fare adjustment was in 1991



Dial-A-Ride Service

- Service area of 55 square miles and is still available to the general public
- 22 Dial-A-Ride wheelchair accessible buses with 16 in service during peak times on weekdays
- Same day service is available Monday-Friday
- Reservations are required for service on weekends and holidays



Dial-A-Ride Hours of Operation

- 7 days a week
 - 7am 6pm Monday through Friday
 - 7am 5pm Weekends and Holidays

History of ADA Service

- Mandated by Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) of 1990 (federal term: paratransit)
- More flexibility than Dial-A-Ride
 - Additional hours
 - Tighter pick-up windows
 - Advanced reservations
 - Door to door service



Who can use ADA service

- Riders certified through Valley Metro eligibility process
- A Personal Care Attendant (PCA) (if needed) – individual to assist passenger – person rides free
- Companion at the ADA fare rate
- Service animal



ADA Service Reservations

- Must be made at least 1 day prior to travel can be made up to 14 days in advance
- Scheduled pickups are made within 1 hour, before or after, the requested time
 - Ex: request for 8:30am pickup; can be scheduled for pick up between 7:30am and 9:30am

Regional ADA Service

- Provided by Valley Metro contractor
- Available to ADA eligible residents of all Valley Metro partner cities
- Flat, one-way, \$4.00 fare to any destination within the service area
- Rider's city of residence pays remaining balance of trip cost




Glendale Urban Shuttle (GUS)

 - Monday Saturday 7am to 6:30pm
 - Sundays/Holidays
 8am to 6pm
- GUS 2 Hours of operation
 - Monday Friday 9am to 5:50pm



GUS 3 (Neighborhood Circulator)



- Hours of Operation
 - Monday Friday 8am to 5:00pm

Dial-A-Ride / ADA Ridership

• Total ridership: 74,256 passengers

Analysis of Proposed Fares

• Decrease in Dial-A-Ride ridership

Ву Туре	Percent Reduction in riders
General Public	60%
Senior / Disabled	40%
ADA	20%

- Dial-A-Ride Fares in Fiscal Year 2015-16: \$92,016
- Estimated impact to revenue: +\$23,907
- Average cost to the city per rider: \$33.90 (before fares)



Why not increase fares higher?

- ADA Option ridership on the more costly ADA service may increase
- Regional ADA service incentivizes residents to use local instead of regional service



GUS Fares

Single Passenger	Current	Proposed
General Public	\$0.25	Free
Child (age 5 and younger)	Free	Free
Seniors/Disabled Patrons between 10am and 2pm	\$0.10	Free

- GUS Fares totaled \$21,676 in FY 2015-16
- Average cost per rider: \$8.67



Why eliminate GUS fares?

- Labor intensive
- Better customer experience
- Currently is not cost recoverable
- GUS 1 of only 2 neighborhood circulators in the region that charges a fare (17 total circulators in the region)



Impacts to Transit Budget

- Net positive revenue of \$2,231
- Current operating budget for Dial-A-Ride: \$2,879,318
- Current approximate operating budget for GUS (as a portion of fixed route): \$769K



Fare work plan

- If given direction to proceed with investigating fare adjustments:
 - Continual discussions with Citizens Transportation Oversight Committee (CTOC)
 - Community Outreach Glendale Star, Channel 11, City website
 - Public Meetings in April/May: City Hall, FRAC, Glendale Adult Center

- Council Workshop in May
- Council Voting in June
- Any changes would take place 30 days after
